A service to commemorate the

Fiftieth Anniversary of the Swiss Air Disaster

and to dedicate the new Memorial Garden

Monday 10th April 2023 at 11.00am.

Welcome to St Andrew's Church and to this service of commemoration.

Fifty years ago on Tuesday 10th April 1973, various groups of friends and families left Congrebury and surrounding villages to go on a day trip to Bastle in Switzerland. Shortly before landing the plane got into difficulty and crashed into the Swiss hillside near a village called Herrenmatt, Hochwald. Sadly, twenty members of the Congresbury party died, and as word got round, relatives discovered that in some cases whole families had been lost.

At the Evensong on that first Sunday after the crash Preb. Alex Cran returned from retirement and conducted the service to a packed Church. Today, as a mark of respect for all those who lost their lives, and for their families and loved ones, we will read out the names of all those from Congresbury who died that day and light candles for them on their behalf.

After the service we will then dedicate a new Memorial Garden by the Stable block, next to the Church, as a lasting memory.
